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Rationale: The Center for the Study of Women, Gender, & Sexuality is poised and ready to offer this new major. The CSWGS already offers a broad array of courses regularly taught by joint appointment faculty, Graduate Assistants, and staff. The Center offers rigorous and relevant undergraduate programs, including a certificate and a minor in Women's and Gender Studies (WGST) and a certificate and a minor in LGBTQ+ Studies. Students are so eager to pursue these courses that many double-minor in both WGST and LGBTQ+ Studies, and a small number go through the laborious process of designing a contract major [Note: contract majors can only count 24 hours of WGSS courses. This hurts students who take more than that. A major would allow them to get credit for all of their hours in WGSS]. For students, a WGSS major would stand effectively on its own or pair in exciting ways with another major or minor in another discipline. The WGSS major would encompass our entire curriculum, bringing us up to date with a vibrant, multifaceted, and inherently interdisciplinary field of study that speaks to contemporary societies in ways that are especially evident in the present moment. Students are eager not only to understand and to interrogate social, cultural, and political realities, but also to create change. Grounded in social movements and reaching toward more just and equitable futures, the field of Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies empowers students to become deeply informed agents of personal and collective transformation.
